## **Travis Ramp Construction Sends Aircraft to Mather For Overnight Stays**

SACRAMENTO, CA – The U.S. Air Force will temporarily relocate a projected two to four cargo contract aircraft to Mather Airport each night during construction on a ramp at Travis Air Force Base.

The construction is not expected to affect daytime operations at Travis, but will impact contracted cargo Boeing 747s that are normally parked on the ramp overnight. Mather Airport is currently serving the role of reliever airport for these aircraft, which are contracted with the Department of Defense to provide support to the U.S. military overseas.

Construction is expected to begin in approximately two weeks and will run until December 2005. Travis ramp construction will be completed in sections during that time. The aircraft will arrive at Mather Airport each week during the evening hours and will depart the following morning.

Mather Airport is part of the Sacramento County Airport System, which is responsible for planning, developing, operating and maintaining the county's four airports: Sacramento International, Executive Airport, Mather Airport and Franklin Field.
